- Honister Slate Mine**
Mine visits, Slate Shop, Picnic area, Free car park for customers. Explore Haystacks, Great Gable and many of the Western fells from here or take a walk deep inside Fleetwith Pike.
- Gatescarth**
Jump off the bus here and walk along the Western shore to Buttermere Village. (2m)
 - Buttermere**
Two hotels, tea shops and wonderful lakeside and woodland walks.
 - Rannerdale**
Supposed site of a Norman battle. In spring you must see the Rannerdale bluebells.
 - High Lorton**
Picture book village with a 1000 year old Yew Tree immortalised by William Wordsworth.

- Spout Force**
A short walk from the roadside.
- Whinlatter Visitor Centre**
Check out the Osprey camera watch and wander the many woodland trails. Tea shop, gifts and fun for the children.
- Portinscale**
Stroll into Keswick from here, less than a mile away. Marinas cafe and hotel.
- Keswick**
A thousand things to do. Consider using the Keswick Launch to Nichol End in connection with the Honister Bus - a sort of Cruise/Drive day out.
- Catbells**
Home of Mrs Tiggy Winkle. A moderate climb for the fit with fantastic views of Derwentwater. Take the launch to Hawes End, get the bus back.

- Grange**
Tea shops and riverside walks, Picnic in the woods or play in the River Derwent.
- Bowder Stone**
A 2000 ton boulder balanced on one corner with a staircase to the top!
- Rosthwaite**
Pretty village on the Cumbrian way. Walk from here to Grange.
- Stonethwaite**
Access the high fells and lovely Langstrath. Quaint local inn.
- Seatoller**
Fine food at the Yew Tree after a strenuous visit to the Slate Mine! English Cuisine by day, South African by night! Walk here from Grange along the Allerdale ramble, about 3 miles.
